Sanitary Sewer Line Relocation

Norlite installed and connected the facility's sanitary sewer system to the City of Cohoes sanitary sewer system in the late 1960's with the end disposal point being the Albany County Sewer District North Treatment Plant. By right of way with D & H Railroad, the sanitary sewer line traversed under railroad tracks on the east side of the Norlite property, was embedded in the Salt Kill eastern embankment, and crossed under the Norlite eastern entrance road and then connecting into the City of Cohoes trunk line on Saratoga Street.

In recent years, due to heavy Salt Kill stream flows, a 20 foot section of the sewer line was exposed in the embankment. In cooperation with the City of Cohoes, Albany County Sewer District, and New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Norlite submitted plans and received approval to relocate the sewer line without impact to or by the Salt Kill watershed. The relocated line was constructed on property owned by Norlite on the north side of its Route 32 entrance road via a right of way with CP Rail.

Construction began in July 2015 and was completed in September 2015.
